WHAT IS A DISCIPLE?

"18 Then Jesus came to them and said, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. 19 Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, 20 and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age." Matthew 28:18-20

If an individual was asked, "what is a disciple?" on the street today, their answer would most likely come from a Christian worldview of the term.

Disciple - mathéteuó, which means to follow or be a learner of.

But the term is not unique to the New Testament.

"Plato. . . used the term freely to refer to 'learners' and 'adherents' where there was no danger of misunderstandings. . . Five hundred years before Jesus was born, a disciple was one who committed his all to follow a master teacher." (Hull, Bill The Complete Book of Discipleship 2006, 54).

Hebrews had a structure of discipleship set up called talmidh and limmudh, meaning taught one. (Ex. 24:13, Deut. 31:1-30; Josh. 1:1,2, 1 Chron. 25:8, Is. 8:16, 50:4, 54:13).

"[R]eligious leaders were using the same kinds of activities in the Semitic world. This culture actually pre-dated the Greco-Roman world. The words: mathetes as talmidh: The Hebrew equivalent to mathetes [Greek for – disciple] is talmidh, which means 'taught one'." (Hull, 55).

IMMERSE

This idea of baptism as initiation was what Jesus instructed in the Great Commission.

"The first mark of a disciple is baptism. It is one of the first acts that identifies us as a follower of Jesus Christ and initiates us into a life of obedience. . .baptism is the initiatory rite of the Christian. . .the symbolism of baptism serves as a public statement

of the believer's personal commitment to Christ. . ." (Koessler, John, True Discipleship 2003, 14).

The mature or experienced are to take others with lesser knowledge and help them grow in Jesus is the entire command in Matthew 28:18-20.

Scripture uses the terms of being a baby, infant, or child to describe one's faith (John 3 'Born

again, 1 Cor. 13:11 'Child', 1 Pet. 2:2 'Newborn babes', etc.) God says this because His intention is growth through mentorship (Eph. 4:13-15).

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THE POINT IS 'DO IT!'

To answer our initial question, what is discipleship? It is making learners of those that have God's gift of salvation in Christ Jesus, it is growth.
